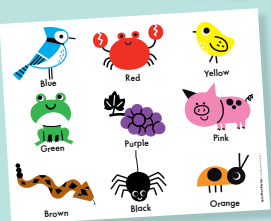

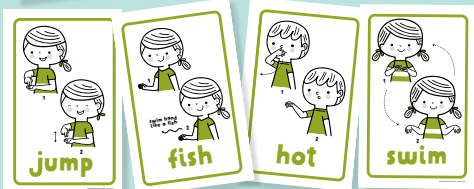

Let's go camping and head out on a playful outdoor adventure! Your child will explore winding trails, forest animals and splashy rivers through songs, stories and hands-on fun. Along the way, these happy discoveries help grow early math, language and movement skills.

Campsite Challenge: Explore camping fun as your child packs a backpack, practices campfire safety and counts and sorts during playful activities.

In the Night: Discover nighttime camping adventures as your child shines flashlights, hunts for the letter B, counts pinecones and moves like forest animals through playful exploration.

Happy Trails: Follow hiking paths and explore nature as your child sorts leaves, matches numbered tents and builds forests and campfires while developing early math and literacy skills.

Down the River: Splash into river adventures as your child "fishes" for letters, counts colorful fish and explores water play.

Backpacks packed and trails to see, camping fun for you and me!



TOGETHER TIME

Sky Discovery



WHAT?	HOW?	WHY?
This week, your child explored stars and the night sky through stories and conversations. You can enjoy looking at the sky together at home.	Take a blanket outside and lie down together while looking up at the sky. Talk about the clouds, birds and anything else you see above you.	Noticing the sky together helps your child learn new words and grow curious about the natural world.

Bears & Balls



WHAT?	HOW?	WHY?
This week, your child explored stories about hiking and carrying a backpack. You can bring the adventure home with a simple outdoor play activity.	Take a teddy bear and a ball outside and place the bear a few steps away. Encourage your child to kick or toss the ball toward the bear, then chase the ball together and try again.	Active play like this helps your child build coordination and strong movement skills while having fun with you.

Hide & Seek Shapes



WHAT?	HOW?	WHY?
This week, your child talked about things we might see or bring on a camping trip. You can turn this idea into a shape hunt during a walk together.	Cut out a square, circle and triangle, then take them on a walk. Look for those shapes together in nature or on buildings you pass.	Looking for shapes helps your child notice patterns and recognize shapes in the world around them.

Fish Colors



WHAT?	HOW?	WHY?
This week, your child practiced counting fish and noticing colors during storytime. You can try a playful "fishing" game together at home.	Cut out fish from different colored paper and place them under a table. Invite your child to crawl under, "catch" the fish one at a time and sort them into matching color groups.	Sorting and counting fish helps your child build early math skills while having fun moving and playing with you.
