Shop the World: Toddlers love discovering new places. Read, look at pictures and pretend to travel together to ignite curiosity and build language.

Amazing Nature: Your child is amazed by mountains, waterfalls and giant trees, even in pictures. Share stories, look at photos and pretend to travel together to inspire a love for nature.

Built by People: Buildings around the world are amazing. Read, build and pretend together to show how people work together and dream big.

With traveling tools and sights to see, your child will journey joyfully, exploring wonders near and far on an adventure that sparks who they are!



DIY Flag Stripes



WHAT?	HOW?	WHY?
In the story of the week, your child learned about many different places and their flags.	Cut strips of colored paper and glue them onto another paper to create a family flag. Ask your child to help you choose colors that represent your family and add shapes or symbols that feel meaningful.	This activity builds family unity and pride as you work together to create something special that celebrates who you are.

Cookie Club

This week's story is about a little mouse who makes a clubhouse where everyone is welcome, just like your family can create welcoming spaces together at home.	Turn it into a family tradition by creating a special cookie club at home. Bake cookies together and invite neighbors, grandparents or friends to join in for a sweet family gathering.	Sharing cookies as a family helps nurture kindness and teaches children the joy of thinking about others and showing they care.

City Landmarks



WHAT?	HOW?	WHY?
In the story of the week, we read a book about many different places with amazing landmarks.	Take a trip and visit a special landmark in your town, such as a statue, fountain, building or bridge and take a photo of your child next to it. Talk about what makes it special and share a fun fact about its history or purpose.	This activity helps your child learn about their community, build pride and understand the concept of special cultural places. Looking at the photo later can spark conversation and help your child remember the experience.

Choo Choo



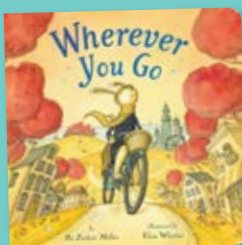
WHAT?	HOW?	WHY?
In the story of the week at school, we read the popular rhyme <i>Down by the Station</i> .	Make curvy and long chalk lines on the ground outside and pretend they are train tracks. Walk, march or chug along them together, making train sounds and stopping at pretend "stations."	This activity builds motor and geography skills by coordinating movements to follow the path and encourages imagination as your child pretends to be the train conductor.
