

SED 2 Self-Regulation	SED 2a Identifies emotions SED 2b Manages feelings and behavior	Show a range of emotions with facial expressions and gestures. Soothes self by seeking a familiar adult or thing.	Expresses likes and dislikes. Experiments and role-plays with a range of emotions.

Points to body parts when prompted.	With help, participates in healthcare routines. Identifies body parts. Describes basic personal needs.

LLD 7 Writing	LLD 5 Uses print concepts and explores books and other text	Recognizes if pictures are right-side up. Turns pages from front to back of book.	Identifies the front/back and top/bottom of a book. Indicates where to start reading on each page.
