

Respond: Follow the child's lead

36 Shared Experience Cards

Each card offers a new idea for how to play with a child to inspire communication, movement or exploration. You can use the ideas naturally throughout the day while a child plays on the floor, during diaper changes or while outside on a walk. Learning happens naturally all day. Let the child's interests and engagement guide the process.



Each card is color-coded

Purple experiences invite a child to Connect & Communicate. Green experiences invite a child to Play & Explore. Orange experiences invite a child to Move & Grow.

Each card is numbered

There are 12 cards of each color. Use the numbers as a quick identifier while lesson planning.

Each card offers three levels of interaction

Children develop at their own rate. As you play, simplify or increase the challenge to best match the developmental level of the child

Observe


when to wait a while before inviting a child to play:

While you play, take note of the child's engagement, behaviors and interactions.



O Let's Pause. Notice the child's readiness Look for these cues to know Let's Play!

Look for these pre-verbal cues

to know when a child is ready to engage with you:

I am looking at you "You are iffice earl

Set out the materials, play a song or sit close by and look for signs that indicate that the child is ready to play and engage. Check your reference card to help assess if they are ready.


The planning calendar offers a quick overview of all 36 Shared Experience cards and presents a simple approach to responsive planning based on the interests of the child. We recommend that during the natural flow of the day, you share experiences with the baby that support all areas of their development. To facilitate this, we suggest you use at least one of each colored card daily.

Assessment

Refer to the stars as guidance for the activities to observe and document child progress.



If a child's interest and engagement level during a given experience is high, repeat that experience later in the day, or again later in the week.

Experience Baby Music Collection

TYPE & PURPOSE

Instrument Sounds: Listen for the different sounds made by two instruments. The instruments are played interchangeably to support

Soothing: A gentle rocking song helps calm and create a relaxing mood.

Energetic Expression: A vibrant instrumental helps energize and excite the mood. Strong rhythm patterns evoke emotions.

Tempo Change: Listen for a change in the tempo or the volume and respond with whole body by changing movements.

Finger Play: Expose the child to rhyme and repetition to evoke emotion

Sound Play: A variety of nonsense syllables and sounds provide listening experiences with vocal play and experimentation.

Environmental Sounds: An auditory experience exposes the child to the real sounds found in the surrounding environment.

Peekaboo/"Where Is It?": A playful song supports cognitive concepts (such as object permanence and spatial awareness) by hiding and

Body Parts: Encourage the child to become familiar with the names of his or her own body parts and practice how to control, move and use them.


Movement Cues: Encourage gross motor coordination for specific upper/lower body movements. Practice controlling the speed and direction

Nursery Rhyme: Sing a familiar song to expose the child to rhyme and repetition while engaging with music to evoke emotion and invite playful movement.

Storytelling Tools

Young children learn through sensory experiences as they listen, see and touch objects in their surrounding environment. Your Experience Baby system includes a variety of tools that support cognitive development.

Read with Me Every Day helps to create a routine of reading. Includes activities to serve as building blocks for literacy and cognitive development.



When to Play, When to Pause

Pre-verbal communication is always a challenge. That's why we include a reference guide in your Shared Experience card deck. We've listed some of the most common cues you'll encounter, with a translation of each.

Record Observation Information

Document the child's progress on the Individual Observation Form or Group Observation Form. Include notes about the child's engagement level as the child plays. Use this information to plan which experiences you will repeat later in the week.
